THE AUSTRALIAN BEE GEES SHOW A MULTI-MEDIA TRIBUTE CONCERT COMES TO PARKER PLAYHOUSE

FORT LAUDERDALE – The Australian Bee Gees Show, a celebration of one of the most influential and famous musical groups of all time, takes the stage on **Friday, March 27 at 8 p.m.** at the Parker Playhouse in a concert sponsored by WPBT2.

The multi-media tribute concert captures the record breaking Bee Gee's on stage with a mesmerizing resemblance in sound and mannerisms in this theatrical experience that takes a nostalgic trip through the legacy the Bee Gees left behind while celebrating over four decades of the infectious music written by the Gibb brothers.

In 1975, the Bee Gees moved to Miami to record and create their music. At least 2,500 artists have recorded their songs and the Bee Gees are ranked third by *Billboard's Hot 100* as having charted the most number one songs in history (nine) after the Beatles (20) and the Supremes (12). The group was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1997.

In what the *Chicago Theater Review* called, "a true retrospective of their 40 year history," The Australian Bee Gees Show includes early hits ("Massachusetts," "New York Mining Disaster 1941" and "To Love Somebody") and later classics ("Stayin' Alive" and "You Should Be Dancin'.") The concert also features state-of-the-art sound, video clips displayed on giant screens and stunning graphics.

Performing for more than 17 years, The Australian Bee Gees Show has mastered the look, sound and personality of the adored trio, while cementing its reputation as the world's leading Bee Gees show.

The show is from Annerin Productions and co-producer SPI Entertainment, which produced *RAIN – A Tribute to The Beatles*, the show that saw its days performing on cruise ships and then went on to become an internationally acclaimed Broadway show; London's West End production *Let It Be*; Jason Bonham's *Led Zeppelin Experience* and *PFX – The Pink Floyd Experience*.
