

When I get to the Broward Center, I will come from the parking garage across the street or I will be dropped off at the top of the hill at the Amaturo Theater.




Across the street parking garage



Top of the hill: Amaturo Theater


If I am parking in the garage, I will make sure to pay for my parking by using the ¹ "ParkMobile" signs.

There will be cars and people in line. It might get noisy too, but I will stay with my group and patiently wait for my turn to show the ticket.




Once I get to the box office, I and everyone in my group will show our tickets before going into the theater.



Walk in the lobby

Before the show starts, someone will come on stage and make an announcement.



This performance will be interactive, which means I can be part of the show. If Kevin Spencer asks for volunteers, I will stay in my seat and raise my hand to show that I am interested in being a part of the show!



If Kevin Sencer calls on me I will carefully walk up to the stage and follow his directions. It will be fun to be part of the show! After I am finished I will walk back to my seat and enjoy the rest of the show.







During the show I can laugh, dance, and clap during the show while staying in my seat.







I can take a break at any time if I tell my parents or group. Then they will take me to the ABA Centers of Florida Sensory Quiet Room.



I will follow the signs to the sensory quiet room. I can stay there until I am ready to go back to my seat and continue watching the show.



When the show gets too loud, I will use a pair of headphones that will make me feel more comfortable. I can also use a fidget toy while watching the show in my seat.



As the show ends, I will clap for the the actors to show that they did a good job.



After the show is over, I will be able to meet Kevin Spencer! I may have to wait in line before I can take a picture with my group.



I can express "thank you" to the ushers and actors for making me and my group feel welcome.



I had so much watching the show at the Broward Center! I can come back again for another show!
